

Election Day: November 3, 2020

The November 3, 2020, general election is quickly approaching. Register to vote and ensure that your voice is heard.



This November, City residents in Wards 5 and 7 will be casting ballots to select their City Council representatives. Additionally, all registered voters in the City will consider Measure "S". In order to maintain city services, the San Bernardino City Council has voted unanimously to place Measure S on the November 3, 2020 ballot.

Measure S, if approved by voters, would extend the City's general sales tax at a 1% rate until ended by voters. All funds raised by Measure S would remain in San Bernardino and could not be allocated to the State or County.

An independent citizen oversight committee and annual reports to the community are required. Products like groceries and prescription medication would remain exempt from Measure S.


"To prevent reductions to City services including public safety, 911 emergency response, gang/prostitution prevention programs, street/pothole repairs, park/library maintenance, youth after-school, senior and homelessness programs, cleaning public areas, retaining/attracting businesses, and other general services, shall a measure extending the City of San Bernardino's sales tax at a one percent rate, providing approximately \$40,000,000 annually until ended by voters, requiring independent audits, oversight, and all funds used locally, be adopted?"

The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department continues to reach and serve City residents through a variety of social media platforms by providing fun and creative activities that include virtual cooking demos, community exercise challenges, Grab n' Go fine arts, virtual game nights, and video zoom community hangouts

Senior Services in the News

Senior Services has not ceased to provide an optimal level of services to the City of San Bernardino's senior community through several programs that provide daily life essentials.

Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) has 180 volunteers poised and ready to serve the community by putting their skills and life experiences to work through tutoring children, building homes for low-income families, teaching computer skills and so much more. Services will resume once the COVID-19 restrictions are lifted.

Senior Companion Program (SCP) continues to provide clients with volunteer hours to safely perform grocery shopping for essential items, pickup of medications, and client delivery to medical appointments.

Senior Nutrition

The Senior Nutrition staff has been working diligently to provide Grab n' Go meal services to the senior community. The program distributes an average of 3500 meals per month from 6 sites: Fifth Street, Perris Hill and Highland Senior Centers, Rudy C. Hernandez and Lytle Creek Community Centers, and the New Hope Family Life Center.

Community Food Distribution

The Parks Department in partnership with non-profit organizations continues to provide community food distribution services at Perris Hill and Fifth Street Senior Centers, Delmann Heights and Rudy C. Hernandez Community Centers. Days and times of services vary for each location. Some programs require additional registration information. J.C Penny to Stay!

Good news for the Inland Empire was shared on Wednesday, August 12, when J.C. Penny announced they had been removed from the list of locations that were set to be closed due to bankruptcy brought on by the coronavirus pandemic. The City was happy to learn that after many discussions and continued to work with mall owner, the newest large box retailer to our community will be staying for the foreseeable future.

The San Bernardino Sun reported: "As JCPenney continues to evaluate its retail footprint and make strategic decisions for the future of the business, some stores have been removed from the previously announced list of closures and will remain open, including our store at Inland Center Mall," the company said in a statement. "We look forward to continue serving our customers in San Bernardino with many safety precautions in place.

"Terri Relf, the mall's senior marketing manager, said Inland Center officials are "extremely happy" to keep the anchor department store open and about 300 people employed. "They continue to be a great asset to the mall, the community and our shoppers," she added, "and we look forward to partnering with them for many years to come."

J.C. Penney is open for in-person shopping from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday. The location will begin offering curbside pickup Thursday.
