On the Cover: Animal Services Offering Free Pet Adoptions Through August 31

Free adoptions will be available for all pets through Wednesday, August 31 at the San Bernardino Animal Shelter thanks to a partnership with local television stations KNBC4 and Telemundo52 and their "Clear the Shelters" campaign. The free adoptions include all vaccinations, microchip, and spay/neuter surgery.

Like most shelters across Southern California, San Bernardino has been exceeding its housing capacity for dogs all year. Despite having 130 dog kennels, they have regularly housed over 150 dogs.

"We are asking for help from our community members to come out and adopt some of our pets," said San Bernardino Animal Services Director Kris Watson. "We are extremely grateful to our partners at KNBC4 and Telemundo52 for helping to make this possible. We have so many amazing dogs and cats right now looking for families to give them a home."

The City of San Bernardino Animal Shelter is located at 333 Chandler Place, San Bernardino, CA 92408 and is open to the public Tuesday through Saturday from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm. For more information, call (909) 384-7272.

The Drought: Take Small Steps this Summer for Big Water Savings

California's drought has left some local areas in worse shape than others. After the driest first three months of a year in the state's recorded history, the Governor asked local water suppliers to take action to conserve water.

Following other unprecedented conservation measures implemented across the state, the news has featured so many different local water restrictions for other cities that many are confused as to what applies in San Bernardino.

At this time, SBMWD continues to be in Stage IIA of its Water Shortage Contingency Plan, where customers may continue to water outdoors for up to three days per week and fifteen minutes per station per day on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays before 8:00 a.m. and after 6:00 p.m.

The Water Department provides water conservation programs and resources to promote water use efficiency and encourages customers to take daily steps to save our local water supplies. For more

STAGE 2A WATER USE EFFICIENCY STANDARDS ARE IN EFFECT

An important part of long-term water conservation is reducing outdoor water waste. To raise efficiency awareness and encourage wise use of water, the following outdoor water use efficiency standards are currently in effect:



Irrigation on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays only.



Irrigation is prohibited for 48 hours following rainfall of 1/8" or more.



Irrigation before 8:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M.



Automatic shutoff nozzles required when washing vehicles.



Maximum irrigation cycles of 15 minutes per station per watering day.



All leaks should be corrected within 72 hours of Department notification.



No watering of outdoor landscapes which causes excessive runoff.



No washing down driveways or other hardscapes.

Library

State Park Day Passes Now Available at All Four City Library Locations

When the State Park Day Pass program was launched by the State earlier this year allowing residents to check out a free day pass from their local library, Feldheim Central Library was the only local library selected to participate. Now, San Bernardino residents with a library card can check out free day-use entry passes at all four San Bernardino Libraries.



The California State Library Parks Pass is valid at over 200 participating state parks throughout California. The passes are valid for park entry for one passenger vehicle with capacity of up to nine people or one licensed motorcycle.

The passes may be checked out for a period of up to three weeks with a city of San Bernardino permanent library card that is in good standing. Park passes may not be placed on hold, renewed and need to be returned in person during regular library hours. They are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Since 1987, Library Card Sign-up Month is held each September to mark the beginning of the school year. During the month, libraries across the nation unite in an effort to ensure every child signs-up for their own library card.

Public librarians and library staff help parents and caregivers save hundreds of dollars on educational resources and services for students. From free access to programs/activities, educational apps, in-person and virtual homework help, technology workshops to the expertise of librarians, a library card is one of the most cost-effective back-to-school supplies available.

Animal Services Awarded \$200,000 to Expand Volunteer and Pet Recovery Programs

San Bernardino Animal Services has been awarded two grants through the UC Davis School of Shelter Veterinary Medicine totaling \$200,000 to help support their efforts to grow their volunteer network and return lost pets to their owners.

San Bernardino has received \$180,000 from the "California for All Animals" initiative to fund volunteer and foster coordinator positions. These positions will allow Animal Services to increase the number of volunteers providing care to the animals at the shelter and grow the number of community foster homes for pets.

"This will have a huge effect on the individual attention the pets under our care receive," said Animal Services Director Kris Watson. "Our Shelter volunteers and foster families make a huge difference for our animals.

Animal Services also received a \$20,000 grant from the California Animal Welfare Funders Collaborative. These funds will expand bilingual notifications of lost pets at the shelter, free microchipping in the field, and fund minor fence repairs at homes to keep pets on their property.

Economic Development News

Carousel Mall Redevelopment Moving Forward

Two recent high-profile actions by the San Bernardino City Council have signaled that progress continues to occur in the redevelopment of the 43-acre Carousel Mall site, a project envisioned to revitalize San Bernardino's downtown. This activity has also spiked interest in other downtown properties.

On August 3rd, the City Council approved adding national real estate developer Lincoln Property Company (LPC West) to the development team as the project's principal partner, joining RD-ICO. On July 20, the Council approved seeking bids to demolish and clear the Mall property.



LPC West is the second largest apartment operator in the United States and has developed over 130 million square feet of mixed-use space throughout the country. They finance, construct, and operate large projects that bring together housing, office, and commercial space in one location.

"With their proven track record of successfully developing large projects across the country, many inland cities have wanted to do business with Lincoln," said City Manager Robert Field. "Having them committed to the Carousel Mall project speaks volumes about downtown San Bernardino's potential."

The addition of LPC West to the development team is part of a third amendment to an exclusive negotiating agreement (ENA) with the current development group, RD-ICO, a partnership between Renaissance Downtowns USA and ICO Real Estate Group. The ENA, which runs through September of 2023, includes timeframes and milestones that must be met to ensure the project continues to proceed in a timely matter.

While the City and LPC West work to finalize a sale agreement to redevelop the Carousel Mall property, the City will be seeking proposals to demolish the mall.

"Having the City move ahead with the demolition and clearing of the mall property while we work with LPC West on the terms of the sale and the development plan helps expedite the process tremendously," said San Bernardino Director of Community, Housing, and Economic Development Nathan Freeman.

Also, with news of the addition of LPC West spreading, there has been an immediate heightened interest in other downtown San Bernardino properties as well.

"We know the redevelopment of the Carousel Mall will serve as a catalyst to transform the entire downtown area," said Freeman. "With the project continuing to move forward along with the addition of LPC West, the number of phone calls we have received from additional developers has increased. Things may be happening faster than we envisioned."

Public Works

City Partners With Rialto for Pepper Avenue Street Improvement Project

The City, has partnered with the City of Rialto on a street improvement project on Pepper Avenue between Mill Street and Base Line Street. The project will encompass a two-mile section of roadway that spans both cities and two San Bernardino City Council wards (3 and 6).

“Residents have been asking for Pepper Avenue to be improved for some time,” said City Manager Robert D. Field. “We are pleased to be working with the City of Rialto to make this happen.”



The project will include pavement replacement and rehabilitation, as well as the installation of ADA accessible ramps and construction of new sidewalks to connect existing gaps. Work is expected to begin later this year and be completed by mid-2023.

Based upon an agreement approved in 2020, the City of Rialto will reimburse San Bernardino 50% of the project total cost.

State Street to be Extended Between 16th Street and Base Line Street

On August 17, the City Council awarded a construction contract to extend State Street between 16th and Base Line. Construction is expected to begin in September with an anticipated completion date of June, 2023.

The project, envisioned for over 20 years, has been long delayed due to funding and environmental issues.

Three additional phases of the State Street extension are envisioned for future projects that will ultimately take State Street to 5th Street.

City Receives \$995,000 from County to Improve Guadalupe – Sal Saavedra Field

The City has been awarded \$995,000 by the County of San Bernardino to make improvements to Guadalupe – Sal Saavedra Field, a 2.25-acre park on Roberds Avenue in the westside of the city. The project will renovate the existing building & baseball field, upgrade lights, replace fences, install new bleachers and scoreboard, and install new park amenities.

“When I was a kid, I learned to play baseball at Guadalupe Field,” said Ward One Councilmember Theodore Sanchez. “This place means a lot to many of us in the community, and it is exciting to see it being renovated.”

“This is a great investment in our kids, our families, and our community,” said County Supervisor Joe Baca, Jr., who worked with the City and the San Bernardino Pony League to develop a plan for



the park. “My father played fast pitch softball at Guadalupe Field and I spent many hours there growing up.”

Construction bids will be sought by the City in August or September with work on the project likely to begin later this year.

Water Department Receives \$5.5 Million for Reservoir Upgrades

The San Bernardino Municipal Water Department has been awarded \$5.5 million to help fund critical seismic upgrades from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES).

The grant will help fund four reservoir seismic retrofits which will enhance long term water supply resiliency. Thanks to Congressman Pete Aguilar for his support which was instrumental in helping to secure this grant.

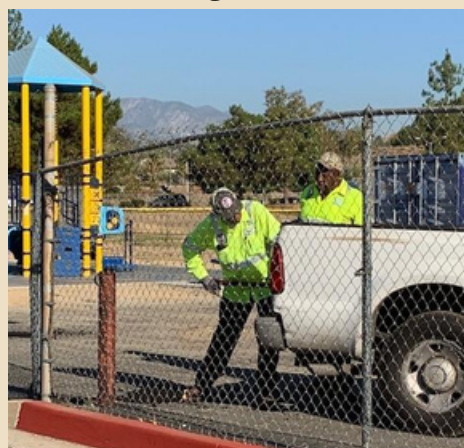
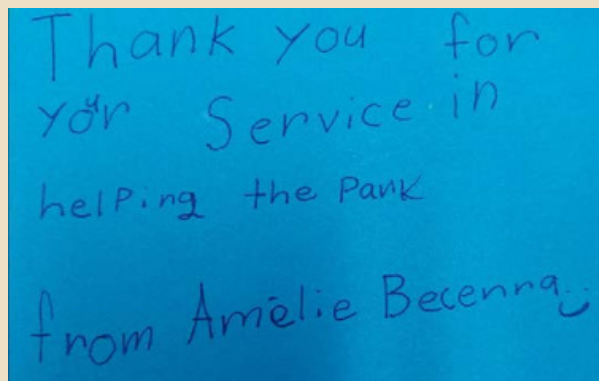
"All Hands" Cleanup Transforms Blair Park

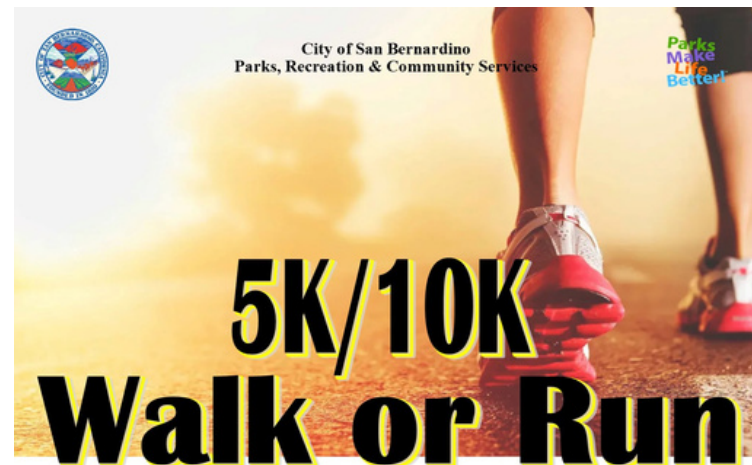

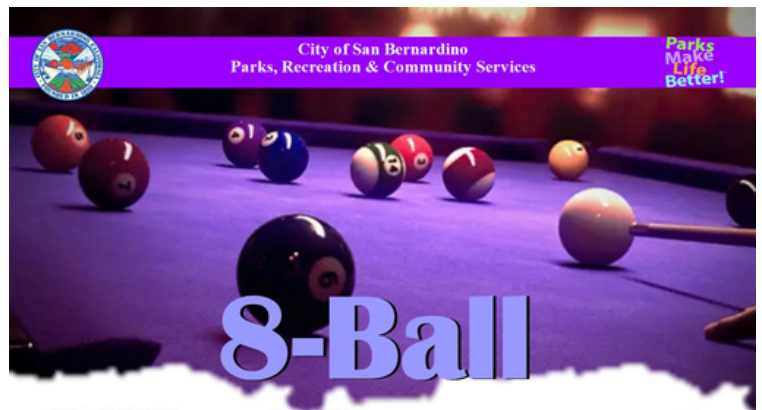
