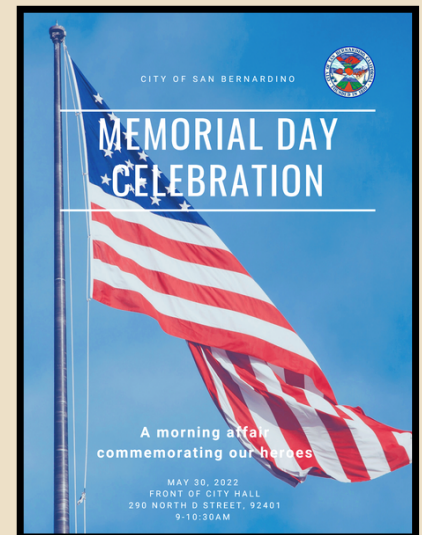

The City of San Bernardino will be remembering our family, friends, and neighbors who have paid the ultimate sacrifice in service on behalf of our nation.

A Memorial Day Celebration will be held at 9:00 am on Monday, May 30th at footsteps of the the San Bernardino City Hall building and fountain, located at 290 North D Street.

The program will include distinguished speakers, invocation, presentation of the flag ceremony and carnation dedication.



Hometown Hero Street Banner Program Returns

San Bernardino has brought back its Military Street Banner Program to salute its hometown heroes. The City is seeking the names of military personnel currently serving in the armed forces to honor with a banner to be installed on streetlights near the civic plaza, and then spreading throughout the city. There is no cost to participate in the program.

In addition to active duty service members, reservists and veterans who reside in San Bernardino may also be honored with banners. Special Gold Star banners will be produced in memory of service members who died while serving.

All military street banner participants or living family members will be invited to a City Council meeting as part of a formal presentation and recognition by the Mayor and Council.

Service members or their families must submit an application along with Verification of Military Status (DD-214) and a color 5x7 image of the service person. POLICE

Police Crackdown on Illegal Street Takeovers

The San Bernardino Police Department is taking a zero-tolerance approach to street takeovers. Arrests, citations, and the impounding of cars are getting the message out that San Bernardino is not the place for these activities.

On April 30, Police encountered an individual in the area of Waterman and Baseline racing around in circles in several laps around the intersection before taking off. After a brief pursuit, the suspect was arrested for exhibition of speed and felony evading and the car was impounded.

There were several takeovers in San Bernardino and surrounding cities on Sunday May 1. SBPD had a team deployed to address the problem. The team disrupted takeovers at several intersections and made 19 misdemeanor arrests, one felony arrest, issued six citations and towed eight vehicles.

The street takeover crews were back in San Bernardino on May 11. Once again, SBPD responded and made 16 arrests, cited 22 people, towed 12 cars, and took a collision report caused by one of the "less than talented drivers."

Some people have to learn things the hard way, and these street takeover crews are no exception. They decided to come back to San Bernardino on May 15 and many of them left on foot or got a free ride to jail. Officers made 12 arrests, issued 22 citations, and towed 13 cars from those who came here with the intent of creating havoc.

The bottom line is in San Bernardino, street racing and takeovers will not be tolerated.

Water Department

Water Department Receives Funding to Assist Qualifying Residents' Sewer Bill

In January, The CA State Water Resources Control Board, provided \$1.07 million in funding to the Water Department to assist 3,048 qualifying customers with delinquent WATER bills.

In May, the Water Department received \$517,000 to assist 1,618 qualifying customers with delinquent SEWER bills. Qualifying customers will see a credit on an upcoming bill and will be notified of the assistance via mail.



Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)

ERAP Program on Hold While City Works to Obtain Additional Funding to Assist Residents

The Emergency Rental Assistance Program, or ERAP is a program intended to help eligible households cover rental and utilities arrears, to assist with prospective payments for rent and utilities, and to provide funding for housing stabilization services and other housing related expenses.

In San Bernardino, the ERAP program has been extremely successful, providing over \$12 million in critical assistance to almost 1,400 households in the city. (See the table below for totals)

At this time, all funding from the U.S Treasury and California Department of Housing and Community Development has been allocated and new applications are not being accepting at this time.

There is still significant need for assistance in the community. The City is continuing to request more emergency rental assistance funding from the State and the U.S Department of Treasury.

It is our hope that another round of emergency rental assistance funding will become available so we can assist additional San Bernardino residents and landlords during this difficult time.

Council Approves 27 Block Sierra Way Street Improvement Project

The San Bernardino City Council approved a contract for street improvements on a twenty-seven-block stretch of Sierra Way between 3rd Street and 30th Street. The \$2,093,700 project will encompass two and a half miles of roadway and span three City Council wards (1, 2 and 7).

The project will include pavement replacement and rehabilitation, as well as the installation of ADA accessible ramps and construction of new sidewalks to connect existing gaps. Work is

expected to begin in June and be completed by October 2022.

This is the fourth major road project approved by the City Council in the past five months with a total cost of \$15.8 million.

Funding for this project will come from Measure I funds, the County sales tax measure passed by voters in 1989 and 2004 for road and transportation improvements.

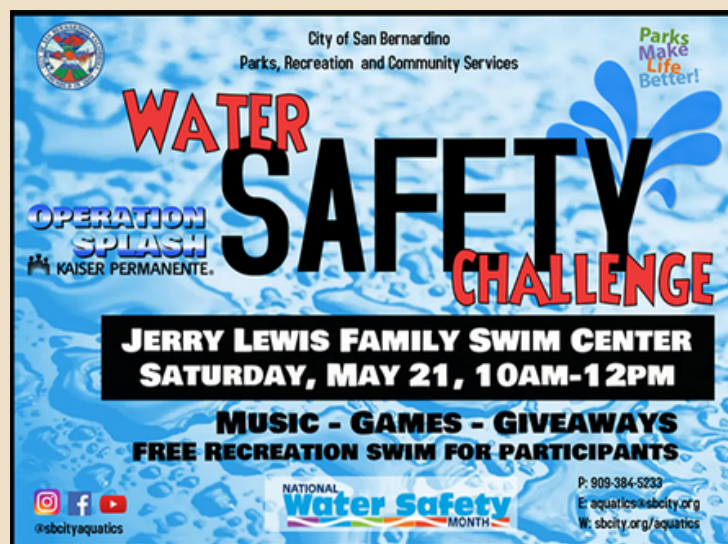
Water Safety Month Encourages Pool Safety

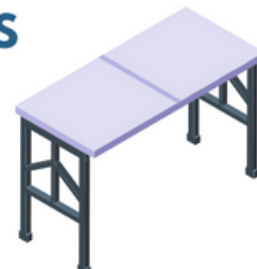
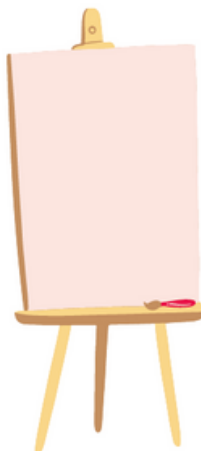
