## Planning Commission Approves Two New Restaurants and the Expansion of Another

At the October 11 Planning Commission meeting, the Commission approved conditional use permits for a new Habit Burger Grill on 2nd Street near the 215 Freeway and a Rally's on Highland near Palm.



The Commission also approved a proposal for In-N-Out on 5th Street to expand their parking lot and increase the size of their drive through from one lane to two and to accommodate up to 30 vehicles.



## Target and Sprouts Part of a New Development Coming to San Bernardino

On September 21, the Mayor and City Council unanimously voted to enter into an Exclusive Negotiating Agreement (ENA) with Rich Development Enterprises, LLC., to develop a 17.4-acre site that will include national retailers Target, Sprouts Farmers Market, and Burlington, along with space allocated for an additional retailer, four restaurant pads, and a gas station/convenience store. The property to be developed is located on Highland Avenue adjacent to the 210 Freeway, between Arden Avenue and Guthrie Avenue in the northeast part of San Bernardino. The City-owned site is known by many as the Arden-Guthrie property.

The conceptual proposal calls for 226,000 square feet of commercial space, with primary access to the center coming from Highland and Arden Avenues. This will be the second Target store in San Bernardino, joining one on Orange Show Road. The nearest Sprouts location is currently in Redlands.

Rich Development officials estimate that in addition to several hundred construction jobs, the center



create between 500 and 600 permanent jobs.

The drought tolerant park connects Campo Santo Park with North Arrowhead Avenue and features a walkway, sitting area, and a Dia de los Muertos themed mural by local artist Christian Mariscal.

The timing for the completion of the pocket park is perfect, as the Parks, Recreation, and Community Services Department is planning a Dia de los Muertos event there on November 1st.



# Street Improvements Continue in SB

## City Kicks Off Two Street Improvement Projects

### State Street Extension

Neighbors, current and former elected officials, city staff, and members of the Northwest PAC celebrated the extension of State Street at a groundbreaking ceremony on October 3rd.

The State Street Extension Project is located just south of the 210 Freeway and parallels the Lytle Creek Basin. It has been envisioned for over 20 years. The project will include the construction of a new four lane divided roadway along with medians, sidewalks, and storm drains.

The new street will improve connectivity to the freeway, decrease cut through traffic in neighborhoods, and provide better access for residents to Arroyo Valley High School and Anne Shirrells Park.

Construction on the half-mile long project is expected to be completed next summer.

### San Bernardino and Rialto Partner to Improve Pepper Avenue

The Cities of San Bernardino and Rialto held a groundbreaking ceremony on October 17, to commemorate the launch of a co-funded project to improve Pepper Avenue between Mill Street and Base Line Street.

The project will include pavement replacement and rehabilitation, as well as the installation of ADA accessible ramps and construction of new sidewalks to connect existing gaps.

San Bernardino Mayor Pro Tem Juan Figueroa and Sixth Ward Council Member Kimberly Calvin spoke highly of the partnership between the cities.

"It is so good to work with our counterparts from the City of Rialto on a project that benefits both of our residents," said Figueroa.

Work is expected be completed by mid-2023.

# Improvements Coming to Speicher Park

## City Receives Nearly \$2 Million from San Manuel and County to Renovate Speicher Memorial Park

The City of San Bernardino has announced nearly \$2 million in grants from the County of San Bernardino and the San Manuel Band of Mission Indians to fund major upgrades to Rick Speicher Family Memorial Park.

San Manuel has committed \$1 million for the project and the County of San Bernardino has committed \$950,000.

The funding will be used to renovate the fields, including the installation of artificial turf, upgrade lighting, install new bleachers, install a new scoreboard, demolish and construct a new snack bar, two new ADA compliant bathrooms, and upgrade other park amenities.



"I'm honored to be a part of this partnership with the San Manuel Band of Mission Indians, the City of San Bernardino, and San Bernardino County," said Supervisor Joe Baca, Jr., who presented an oversized ceremonial check to the city council. "Working together we are able to invest in open space and park improvements for our deserving families to enjoy."

The 28-acre park, located on Arden Avenue near Pacific Street in the northeast part of the city, is heavily used by members of the community, baseball and softball leagues, skateboarders, and by students from San Geronimo High School, which is located across the street from the park.

"We are grateful to San Manuel and Supervisor Baca for funding to help transform Speicher Park," said San Bernardino Council Member Sandra Ibarra, who represents the area. "By this time next year, visitors to the park will be amazed by all the improvements."

Earlier this year, the Mayor and City Council approved spending \$650,000 for a separate project to replace Speicher's skate park, which was forced to close earlier this year. After working with local skaters on a vision for a new skate park. Construction on the skate park will occur in 2023.

## Public Works Crews Clean Up Debris From Tropical Storm Kay

On September 10, the streets and foothills of San Bernardino took a surprise pounding from a rare summer storm called Tropical Storm Kay.

While the storm hit the entire City, Wards 2, 4, 5, and 7 were most impacted along with a small portion of Ward 6 - parts of the City with hills or historically prone to flooding. The amount of mud debris/silt was likely record-breaking.

In the aftermath, Public Works crews put in long hours for several weeks to ensure that the roads were cleared, fallen trees were removed, and the system would be ready for any storms to hit this winter. Shifts were often 12 hours long.

In total, 1,666 cubic yards of debris was cleaned up. That is equivalent to about 180 large dump trucks. Mud/silt was removed on roadways, as well as on sidewalks, driveways, gutters, storm drains, and parking lots. Much of the work had to be performed manually, although a large dump truck, extra loaders and street scrubbers were used to assist crews.

In preparation for the rainy season and potential future heavy rain events, a city-wide re-inspection of all storm drains and city-owned culverts is underway along with any necessary work to clear any obstructed drains.

Kudos to our Public Works crews for going above and beyond this past month!

A great time was had by all!

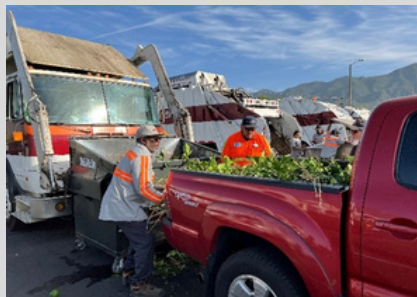


# Keep San Bernardino Clean

## Next Community Dump Day is Set for October 29 at Blair Park

The next monthly Community Dump Day will take place on Saturday, October 29 from 8:00 am to 11:00 am at Blair Park, located at 1466 W. Marshall Boulevard. San Bernardino residents can discard bulky items, tires, e-waste and metal. Construction and Hazardous materials will not be accepted, and proof of residency with either ID or a utility bill must be shown.

Dump days occur the last Saturday of every month at a selected location. There are only two remaining Dump Days in 2022. Looking ahead, the November 19 event will take place at Perris Hill Park.



### Important Dump Site Information

City of San Bernardino residents may drop off unwanted items such as appliances, mattresses, tires, furniture, tree limbs and electronic waste.

- This is for household refuse only.
- Be prepared to show proof of residency with a driver's license or gas/electric/water bill.
- **NO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS** - This includes paints, oil, batteries and household or industrial chemicals, etc.

## New Train Service Connects San Bernardino and Redlands

On Monday, October 24, passenger service began on the Arrow train line, with service to five stations over nine miles between downtown San Bernardino and the University of Redlands.

The Redlands Passenger Rail Project, known as Arrow, has been more than a decade in the making. It features new tracks, enhanced street crossings, quiet zones, and five stations along the 9-mile route between downtown San Bernardino and Redlands. Arrow's new train engines bring state-of-the-art clean-air rail technology to one of the world's busiest transportation corridors.

Five new stations will connect residents, businesses, and visitors to a variety of leisure, education, healthcare, and other destinations. The new stations are San Bernardino – Downtown Station located at Rialto Avenue and E Street, San Bernardino – Tippecanoe Station located between Victoria Avenue and Hardt Street, Redlands – ESRI Station across from the ESRI campus, Redlands – Downtown Station just north of the historic Redlands Santa Fe Depot, and Redlands – University Station at the south end of the campus.

The service is a partnership between the San Bernardino County Transportation Agency and Metrolink.

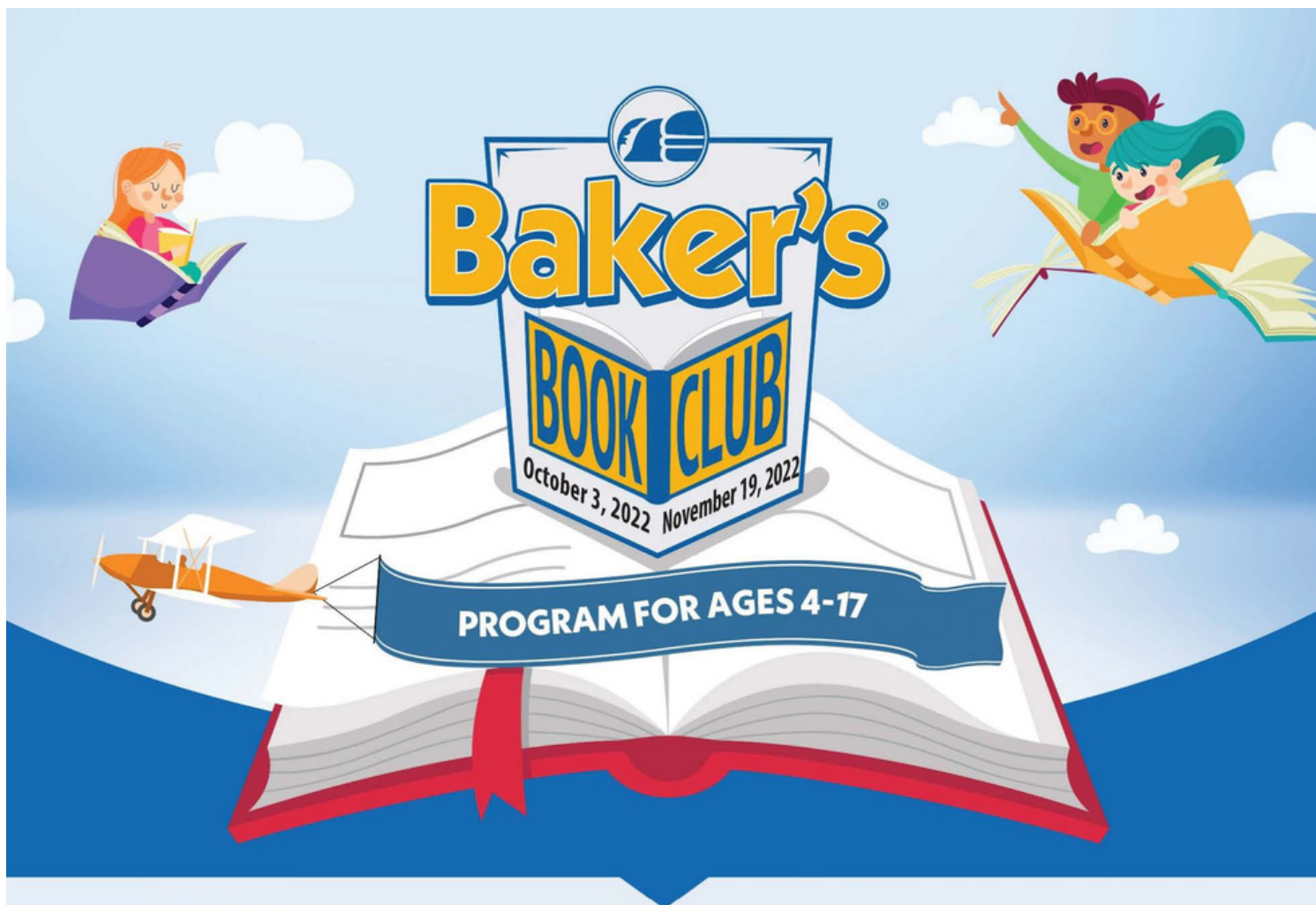

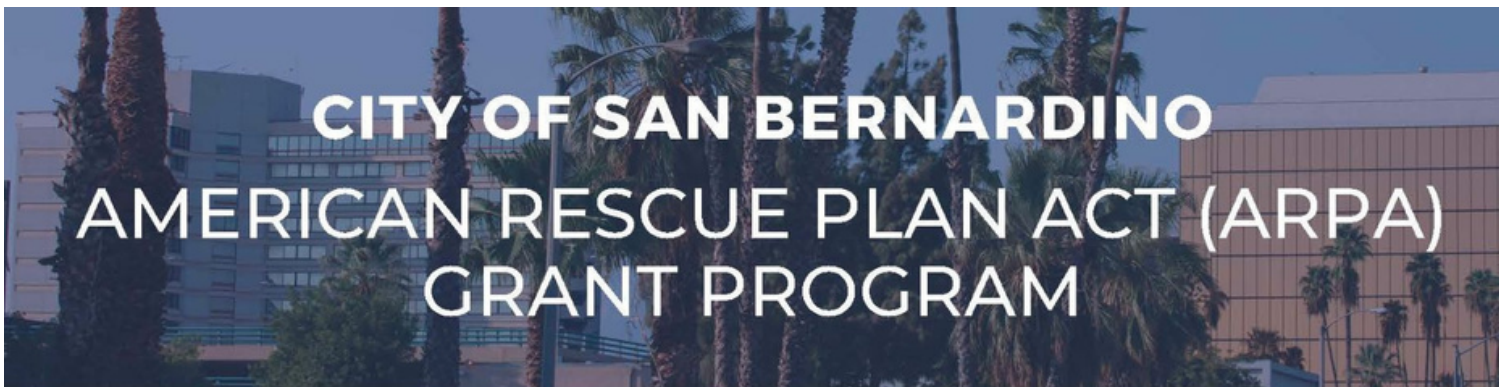

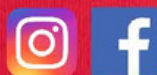
