Breaking Ground with San Manuel Band of Mission Indians

The San Manuel Band of Mission Indians was joined by civic leaders and community partners on Friday, July 23, to break ground on San Manuel Landing – a state-of-the art commercial center, supply and logistics facility that will further the Tribe's commitment to long-term investment in the economic development of the region. The ceremony was held at the former Norton Air Force Base, where the new facility will be built.

The 1.1M square foot complex is thoughtfully designed, incorporating a greenway park heralded by the iconic Norton Air Force Base water tower at its entrance with extensive landscaping throughout. The center will use innovative "green" technology, including solar energy, accommodations for electric truck and vehicle charging, and an onsite truck staging area. An art mural on a prominent wall of the Landing will illustrate the inter-connected history shared by the Tribe and the former Norton site.

General Plan Update



Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)

The City of San Bernardino has established the City of San Bernardino Emergency Rental Assistance Program that will leverage more than \$6.4 million in U.S. Treasury funds to provide rental and utility assistance to residents that rent or lease an apartment or house and are financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The City has teamed up with Inland SoCal 211+, a subsidiary of Inland SoCal United Way, to administer the program which will provide up to 12 months of rental and utility arrears (i.e., past due payments) for low income renters in the City.



There is still funding available and eligible renters are urged to apply today. Landlords and tenants are strongly encouraged to work together to complete applications as quickly as possible. Tenants are encouraged to communicate their interest in applying for the program with their landlords.

Note: Based on direction by the State Department of Housing and Community Development and the U.S. Treasury Department, the City is considering modifying the program to cover future rent payments and security deposits as well. The Mayor and City Council will consider these changes at their August 18, 2021 Mayor and City Council meeting. Additional changes may be forthcoming based on direction from these two outside agencies.

How to apply?

Inland SoCal 211+ has teamed up with several agencies in San Bernardino to provide in-person application support. For inperson application appointments applicants can call IE Rebound at (909) 474-9212 or Operation Grace at 909-382-8540 to schedule an appointment. Those who have access to the internet are strongly encouraged to apply via the portal at sbcityrent.com as they will be able to check application status through the portal after completing their application. Applicants can also call 855-SB-APPLY, Monday – Saturday from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m., to submit their application via phone.

What is included in the assistance?

Eligible renters can receive up to 12 months of past due rent and utility assistance with no cap. Future rent and deposits may also be eligible for funding.

Who Qualifies?

The City of San Bernardino Emergency Rental Assistance Program is a program for renters in the City who fall at or below 80% Area Median Income guidelines. Additionally, residents must have a demonstrated financial impact due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a signed lease, and priority is being offered to residents who are or have been recently employed. Immigration status is not a consideration for this program.

2nd Street Bridge Replacement at Warm Creek

Progress continues on our project to replace the existing bridge on 2nd Street over Warm Creek. The construction of the project includes replacing four traffic lanes, installation of drainage systems, replacing pedestrian walkways, and slope stabilization.



Playground Equipment Replacement to be complete by November 1, 2021

From a playground assessment that was completed in FY 2017/18, the City's Parks Department compiled a priority list after determining age, condition, and any safety issues of the existing structures in City Parks. Phase 1 and Phase 2 have been completed resulting in playground equipment improvements at a total of 11 parks. Now in Phase 3, Playground Equipment Replacement, this CIP established project, is being funded through over \$1.1M in Community Block Grant (CDBG) and Quimbly Parkland Funds. Parks receiving upgrades in Phase 3 include Meadowbrook, Anne Shirrel, Blair, Hudson and Tom Gould Parks.

Parks get Outdoor Fitness Equipment

The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department began planning to implement several fitness circuits by identifying various locations, first stop Littlefield Shultis Park located at 2525 W Kendall Way. On Wednesday, July 14, 2021 the department completed its first installation of brand new Outdoor Fitness Equipment.

The equipment is set up adjacent to a paved trail throughout Littlefield Shultis Park will help the community by improving cardiovascular and mental health with exercise activities that will increase strength, flexibility, endurance, and decrease level of stress, anxiety, and depression. Each one of the fitness machines focuses on one, or multiple, fitness areas like cardio, muscular strength, endurance, flexibility, and core strength.

The implementation of this, and future Outdoor Fitness Equipment, will allow residents a chance to begin or continue their fitness journey, provide an area for parents to exercise while their children are playing sports at the playground, and broaden exercise activities in an undeserved community all at no cost.



Some 36 public PCs are available at Feldheym Central Library (555 W. Sixth St.), Rowe (108 E. Marshall Blvd.) and Inghram (1505 W. Highland Ave.) Branches each offer eight public PCs, and the Villaseñor Branch offers 10. In addition to internet, our PCs offer the Microsoft Office Suite and various library resources. Patrons only pay for printing. Feldheym hours are Monday – Thursday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Saturday 1 to 6 p.m. Rowe and Villaseñor are open Monday and Tuesday from 3 to 8 p.m. and Wednesday and Thursday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., and Inghram is open Tuesday – Friday from 2 to 6 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Free Wi-Fi is also offered at all libraries. Dog License Amnesty Program

Starting July 1, 2021 through August 31, 2021 residents in the City of San Bernardino can purchase a dog license WITHOUT penalty fees!

This includes residents with expired dog licenses or residents who have never licensed their dog before.

You only need to pay for the current year of licensing and submit a current rabies vaccination certificate. Below are the current license types and the fee for each.

Licensing Fees:

| License Category (Dogs) | One Year | Two Year | Three Year |
|---|----------|----------|------------|
| Regular Unaltered | \$96.00 | N/A | N/A |
| Altered - Dog is spayed or neutered. (Spay/Neuter Certificate is required) | \$24.00 | \$42.00 | \$54.00 |
| Senior - Pet owner is 60+ and dog is spayed or neutered. (Spay/Neuter Certificate is required) | \$12.00 | \$24.00 | \$36.00 |
