After a two year hiatus due to the COVID pandemic, ArtsFest is returning to downtown San Bernardino on Saturday, March 19 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm for a day of fun and food at the Court Street Square, located on Court Street between D Street and E Street. The event is free to attend.

This year's ArtsFest will feature musical performances, dancers, theatrical performances, local artists, and food vendors showcasing some of the best in performance, creative, and culinary arts from San Bernardino. Performers and artists from local schools also participate, including local K-12 schools, San Bernardino Valley College and Cal State San Bernardino.

In addition to selling their arts, crafts and other creative works, some artists will be demonstrating the techniques they used to create their pieces. There will also be activities specifically geared for children to participate in, including sidewalk chalk art.

Street Improvements Coming To a Neighborhood Near You

The City Council approved the second phase of a four phase, 53-street plan to repave and resurface streets and repair sidewalks throughout San Bernardino. The most recent contract, approved on February 2, will encompass segments of nine streets in the city. Work on this phase, which will also include ADA accessible ramps, drainage, sidewalk installation, signage, and curb/gutter improvements, will begin later this month and should be completed by June 2022.

Streets that will be improved during this phase are:

- King Street: between K Street and Mt. Vernon Avenue (Ward 1)
- Highland Avenue: between 210/215 interchange and Lincoln (Ward 2)
- K Street: between Mill Street and Hillcrest Avenue (Ward 3)
- Pumalo Street: Arden Avenue to Sterling Avenue (Ward 4)
- Churchill Street: between Belmont Avenue and Olive Avenue (Ward 5)
- Baseline Street: between Medical Center and Mt. Vernon Avenue (Ward 6)
- 28th Street: between Golden Avenue to end Flood Control (Ward 7)
- Parkdale Avenue: between Mt. View Avenue to Sierra Way (Wards 4 & 7)
- Mill Street: between Allen Street to G Street (Wards 1 & 3)



Bids are currently being sought for phase three, which will encompass fourteen additional streets, with a bid solicitation for twenty-three streets to follow soon after. In December, a contract was awarded for work on the first seven streets. Work on that phase began this month and should be completed in June.

The streets identified for rehabilitation work were prioritized through a March 2020 pavement management analysis completed by the Public Works Department, which used scientific methods to rate the condition of all public streets in San Bernardino.

Police to Host Blood Drive Feb 21 to Address Shortage

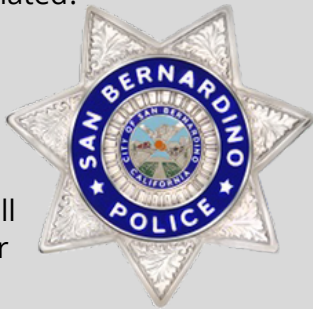
With the state and region's blood supply at critically low levels, the San Bernardino Police Department is partnering with the American Red Cross on Monday, February 21 for a blood drive event.

"While the need for blood is constant, California, along with the rest of the nation, is experiencing the most severe blood shortage in the last ten years," California Health and Human Services Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly said in January.

The Red Cross will be in the training room at the main police station, located at 710 North D Street, from 8:00 am until 2:00 pm. Walk-ins are welcome, but you are encouraged to set up an appointment by calling 1-800-RED-CROSS or visiting www.redcrossblood.org and using the sponsor code SBPD.

A frequently asked question is "Can I donate if I received the COVID-19 vaccine?" or "Can I donate if I am unvaccinated?"

As it turns out, vaccination status does not affect your eligibility to donate. However, all donors will be screened upon their arrival.



Volunteers Needed for February 24 Homeless Point In Time Count

The City of San Bernardino is asking members of the community to volunteer for the annual homeless point-in-time count on February 24th from 5:30 am to 10:00 am at the San Manuel Stadium parking lot, home of the San Bernardino 66ers, located at 280 South "E" Street.

The point-in-time count is a Federally mandated activity to identify the number of unhoused individuals throughout the nation. The results of the count are used in determining critical funding allotments for programs and services in local communities. Counts will be occurring across the County on the 24th of February.

Volunteers could include anyone who would like to help address homelessness in San Bernardino, including social service providers, educational institutions, faith-based organizations, local businesses, civic/nonprofit organizations, neighborhood associations, current and formerly homeless individuals, and community members.

Next Community Dump Day Set for Saturday February 26 at San Manuel Stadium

February 26th is the next monthly Community Dump Day taking place from 8:00 am to 11:00 am at San Manuel Stadium, the home of the San Bernardino 66'ers, located at 280 South E Street. Residents can discard bulky items, tires, e-waste and metal. Construction and Hazardous materials will not be accepted, and proof of residency with either ID or utility bill must be shown.

Dump days occur the last Saturday of every month at a selected location. See the chart below for a the 2022 schedule of dates and locations.

We had a great turnout at the January Community Dump Day at Seccombe Lake Park. Over 200 residents participated. Although a line wrapped around the corner for much the event, it moved very quickly. Some residents even made repeated trips until 11:00AM.

Animal Services - What to do if You Find Abandoned Kittens

This is the time of year when you may see litter of kittens in your neighborhood. Some outdoor cats are "feral," meaning the cat was likely born outdoors and raised with little exposure to people. Most of these cats know where to find food or have a human that feeds them. Unfortunately, many are not spayed or neutered.



Animal Services receives many calls in the Spring about orphaned kittens. Although your first thought may be to call us immediately, we ask that if you see kittens alone, monitor them for a couple of hours. If mom doesn't return in that time, give us a call and we will gladly come out and help. Mom cats can't stay with her kittens full-time and need to hunt so that she can feed her babies. She will find a safe spot to leave her kittens alone for an hour or two.

If mom comes back, the kittens won't need our help immediately. However, we want to make sure mom can't have more kittens and that her babies get adopted into homes. You can help us by fostering mom and kittens until her babies reach eight weeks. Call us when mom comes back and we will help you trap her. Once she and the kittens are secured, we will give you all of the necessary supplies and walk you through how to care for mom so she can focus on her babies. When the babies are weaned, we will find them homes and spay mom!

You can help with orphaned kittens too. We need foster caretakers – kittens without their mom need a lot of care. When you foster kittens for us, we will supply food, formula, bottles, litter boxes, vaccinate the kittens, and get them spayed or neutered before finding them a home.

Animal Services is working to get more of these "Community Cats" spayed or neutered so that we can reduce the unowned kitten population in your neighborhood. We know that not everyone wants cats in their yard, and Animal Services works to gradually reduce the number of stray cats in San Bernardino.

Water Department

Water Department to Consider Rate Changes in March

SBMWD will be conducting a public hearing in March to consider implementing changes to the water and wastewater rates. The public hearing will take place on Tuesday, March 8, 2022 at 9:30 AM at the Norman F. Feldheim Central Library, 555 West 6th Street, San Bernardino, CA 92410. The San Bernardino Municipal Water Department recently completed its first independent cost of service study since 2015 and is considering the adoption of a proposed schedule of increases and changes to the rates and charges for water and wastewater services. These changes are needed to respond to the Department's revenue requirements and to keep pace with the rising costs of providing trusted, quality water and wastewater services. If the proposal is approved by the Water Board, the increases would take effect on April 1, 2022, with subsequent annual increases on July 1, 2022, through July 1, 2025.

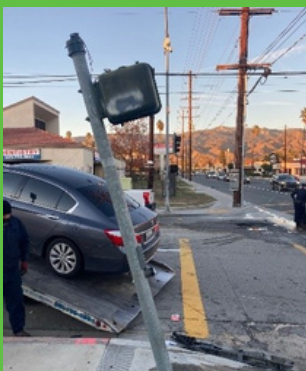

Secombe Lake Park and Pioneer Memorial Cemetery Fencing Project Underway

Additional projects are underway to improve Secombe Lake Park. In February, work began to install fencing at the 45 acre park, along with the adjacent Pioneer Memorial Cemetery.

The fence project, intended to improve security at both locations, is expected to be completed in mid-May.

On February 2, the City Council committed \$8.7 million for additional improvements to Secombe Lake Park. Details and timelines on this work will be highlighted in a future newsletter.
