Community & Economic Development

5th Street Gateway

The 5th Street Gateway project (located on the north side of West 5th Street, between North G Street and North H Street) is comprised of three (3) restaurants with drive-thru and a service station with a 24-hour 7-Eleven convenience store intended to capitalize on the City's commercial, transportation and locational strengths, which has become a major economic driver within the City.

Development of the site will be completed in a manner that will enhance the physical and visual qualities of the subject property thereby enhancing the aesthetics of one of the City's "gateways." The



architectural design features a cohesive contemporary form utilizing angular roof geometries. The design creates a dynamic and vibrant environment appropriate to hospitality and auto-oriented services.

The Beyond Food Mart

The Beyond project (located on the southwest corner of East Baseline Street and North Del Rosa Drive) is comprised of a service station with a 24-hour convenience store which provides healthy food and beverage choices and a drive-thru express carwash. The architectural design is Avant-Garde and stylish with varied rooflines and projections incorporated into the facade, varying paint and façade material schemes to create visual interest on the structure. The incorporation of articulated wall surfaces and features will enhance the visual aesthetics at this intersection. When completed, the Beyond project will transform the vacant and under-utilized site to create an economic benefit to the community.



California Small Business Assistance

Transportation

San Bernardino County Transportation Authory Project Updates

In 2020, the San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA) broke ground on two projects within the City of San Bernardino – SR 210 Lane Addition and Base Line Interchange Project and Mount Vernon Avenue Bridge – and continued construction on the Redlands Passenger Rail/Arrow Project. Redlands Passenger Rail/Arrow Project

The Redlands Passenger Rail/Arrow Project is more than 70 percent complete and bridge construction is almost 100 percent complete. Crews are working throughout the nine-mile corridor between the San Bernardino Transit Center and University of Redlands on grade crossings and platform and electrical work is ongoing at the San Bernardino Transit Center, ESRI, Tippecanoe and Downtown Redlands stations. Beginning Monday, January 4, Waterman Avenue at the rail crossing will be closed for approximately nine weeks for crews to lay track; install grade crossings; pave and reconstruct curb, gutters, and sidewalks; and install cabling for signals. Train testing is scheduled to begin in early 2021. Mount Vernon Avenue Bridge (MVAB) Project

To ensure the safety and longevity of the Mount Vernon Avenue Bridge (MVAB), the City of San Bernardino (City) and the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) have partnered with the San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA) to rebuild the bridge. The bridge will be disassembled and completely rebuilt – a process that will span approximately three years. With the closure of the bridge on Tuesday, December 29, 2020, there is no through access permitted across the bridge, between 2nd Street and 5th Street. Businesses will remain open during construction and access to businesses on Mount Vernon Avenue at 2nd Street and 5th Street, and on Mount Vernon Avenue between W. Kingman Street and 5th Street, will be maintained.

There are pedestrian and vehicle detours in place. Motorists will be directed to use 5th Street to H Street/G Street, to Rialto Avenue to get to and from the other side of the Mount Vernon Avenue Bridge. To support pedestrians, bicyclists, and the disabled with a convenient detour option while the bridge is closed, SBCTA partnered with Omnitrans to offer a complimentary bus service. Bus stop locations nearest the MVAB are shown on the map below, for Route 1 (2nd Street/Metrolink Way), Route 3/Route 4 (5th Street/Mount Vernon), and Route 14 (5th Street/Mount Vernon Avenue). Pedestrians wishing to access the complimentary service can board the bus at the stops below, and say "bridge detour/desvío del puente" to the bus driver upon boarding for the complimentary fare. Riders will transfer between routes at the Transit Center and continue to Route 1 (2nd Street/Metrolink Way), Route 14 (5th Street/Mount Vernon Avenue) to reach the other side of the bridge. SR 210 Lane Addition/Base Line Interchange Project

Since breaking ground in February 2020, widening efforts commenced on ten of the eleven bridges within the project corridor and paving work is underway throughout the project area. Construction is more than 90 percent complete on four of bridges - 5th Street, Base Line Street Pioneer Avenue, and Victoria Avenue. Work is also being performed on the new retaining walls along SR 210 at the Base Line Interchange. In 2021, crews will complete all bridge widening efforts and will shift traffic onto newly paved portions of SR 210 west of City Creek. In additions, crews will begin replacing asphalt lanes with concrete lanes on SR 210 east of 5th Street, will continue construction activity along Base Line, and will begin work on additional retaining and soundwalls throughout the project corridor. 

Gray's Rescue

On January 4th, Animal Control Officer Jodi Kroeger was called out to rescue a dog stuck in a drain. When she arrived on scene, it was clear the dog was firmly wedged in the drain and she would need assistance to rescue him. San Bernardino County Fire Department and their Search and Rescue team responded to our call for help. After a couple of hours, the fire department was able to widen the opening of the drain and free the Husky.





While the fire department was working to free the dog, Officer Kroeger was busy trying to find the animal's owners. After speaking with people in the neighborhood, she was able to identify where the dog lived and called the owner on the phone. The owner let Officer Kroeger know that "Gray" the husky had been missing for two days and the family had been searching for him. Officer Kroeger arranged a time for the owners to pick Gray up after they were home from work. Gray and his family were very happy to be reunited with his family after his long ordeal. Gray's ordeal was featured in the SB Sun as well as local news stations.

Welcome Lowe's Outlet Center

Mayor John Valdivia welcomed Lowe's Outlet to San Bernardino at their Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting on January 4, 2021. The 29,172 square foot store, located at 4060 N. Hallmark Parkway, is anticipated to generate \$4-6 million in annual store sales and generate tax dollars to fund city revitalization initiatives.

This is the second of three outlet locations slated to open in California, and overall, Lowe's intends to open 17 outlet centers nationwide. Situated in the northern region of the city in the 5th ward, the store will feature refurbished appliances (washers, dryers, kitchen appliances, small appliances, etc.) from their Lowe's retail stores at substantially discounted prices.
