Helping to Stay Healthy

With the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) in the Unites States we want to take this opportunity to remind you of the importance of taking preventative measures to protect your health. While the health risk remains low in San Bernardino County, the City is actively monitoring the COVID-19 pandemic, working closely with the San Bernardino County Department of Public Health and following the guidelines established by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). For the safety of our residents and staff, the City is taking preventative measures to decrease the spread of COVID-19 by temporarily suspending public events, recreational programming and the use of public service counters. Additionally, the City's senior nutrition program has been transitioned from a dine-in to a takeout service. Here's what you can do to avoid being exposed:



Clean your hands often

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
- Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alchohol



Avoid Close Contact

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Put distance between yourself and other people



Self Quarantine

• Stay home if you are sick, except to get medical care





Cover Up

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze
- Throw used tissues in the trash
- Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds



Wear a face mask

• If you are sick, you should wear a face mask when you are around other people. If you are unable to wear a face mask, do you best to cover your coughs and sneezes



Clean and Disinfect

- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, counter tops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets and sinks
- If surfaces are dirty, clean them. Use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfction

Cesar Chavez Day Celebration



Cesar Chavez (1927-1993) was an American labor leader, community organizer, and Latino American civil rights activist. He was a union leader and labor organizer who dedicated his life to improving the treatment, pay and working conditions for farm-workers. In 1962 he founded an organization that grew into the United Farm Workers Union, where he negotiated hundreds of contracts and spearheaded a landmark law that made California farm-workers the only ones in the nation entitled to protected union activity. In his most enduring legacy, Cesar Chavez gave people a sense of their own power (2017, Biography.com).

Welcome Home 2 Suites

When is it coming?

In March 2020, The U.S. Census Bureau will mail every household information and how to access the form.

Instructions will guide you to filling out the form online. You also have the option to complete the Census by mail or by phone. You can get additional information by calling (800) 923-8282.

CALLING ALL LIFEGUARDS AND POOL MANAGERS FOR SWIM SEASON 2020!

The City's Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department are gearing up to open the 2020 Swim Season from May through September at these five locations: Jerry Lewis Family Swim Center, Delmann Heights, Hernandez, Encanto Park, and Nunez Pools. The available positions are:

Lifeguard \$13.77 - \$15.19/hr Pool Manager I \$17.31 - \$19.09/hr Senior Lifeguard \$15.65 - \$17.26/hr Pool Manager II \$18.74 - \$20.66/hr

Aquatics Training and Certification classes are offered in March, April, May, and June for Lifeguards and Pool Managers ages 15 years and up. Junior Lifeguard Training Certification classes for ages 11-15 years are offered in three 2-week sessions in June and July at a subsidized fee thanks to a grant contribution from Kaiser Permanente. (The applicant is responsible for all fees for training and certification classes.

All applicants are required to show proof of current Lifeguard Certifications prior to their first day of employment. All interested candidates are invited to review position requirements and apply online at www.SBCity.org/HR
