San Bernardino's Active Transportation Plan

The City of San Bernardino is developing an Active Transportation Plan (ATP)!



The Plan aims to provide localized strategies to improve safety, access, and connectivity for people walking and biking in San Bernardino. Regionally, the San Bernardino ATP will supplement and enhance the County's existing planning efforts. Locally, the ATP will also complement the General Plan Update and Downtown Specific Plan projects.

A multi-modal transportation system provides residents and visitors more ways to get to and from where they want to go, helping improve health outcomes and environmental conditions. Stay tuned for more updates on the San Bernardino ATP! More information and public engagement opportunities will be announced later this month.

The Starfish Story

Mental Health Systems (MHS), a Behavioral Service Organization, in partnership with the City of San Bernardino launched a program called, "San Bernardino City Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)" in the City of San Bernardino as part of its Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) to serve homeless individuals residing within the city. The mission of our program is to provide street outreach, connect with homeless individuals, and provide them with critical services and developing a case management plan that will assist in movement toward self-sufficiency as a contributing member of their community.

One of the six clients we housed last week was a man named Jack (name protected). He had been on the streets of San Bernardino for more than six years and is a senior citizen with a persistent mental health condition and has not been on his medication for over three years. He thought about the things that were being offered to him in service. Although, initially very distrustful during the first several meetings, eventually he decided to take a chance with us, and we saw him outside our door a few days later. All of the details of his story are yet to be told, but we hope to reconnect him to his best possible self. We will support all attempts for wellness and recovery using a "Housing First', and "Harm Reduction" model of treatment, which are both evidence-based practices in treatment and housing mentally ill- homeless individuals.



Client 'Kennv' (name ACT team met protected). with Kenny at Seccombe Lake Park on Friday March 5th. He had lost his wife and had suffered а mental health crisis that left him homeless. "Kenny" walked from Seccombe Lake Park to the MHS offices at 1181 E. Highland Avenue for what he called a "second chance".

He has now seen the psychiatrist, and has been placed in housing. "Kenny" is very grateful for the MHS team and a second chance at life. He plans to return to work and be self-sufficient once more!

This made us reflect on the story referred to as 'The Starfish Story". It talks about thousands of starfish that were being washed up on the shore and dying. A passerby saw a man throwing them back into the ocean one by one. The passerby asked, "Why are you doing this? You can't possibly make a difference". The man held up one starfish, threw it back in the ocean, and smiled stating, "I made a difference for that one." For us at MHS, that story reminds us of our purpose. We have been given the challenge and privilege to work with folks like "Jack" and we are making a difference one life at a time.




Street, Pothole & Sidewalk Repairs

The team is dedicated to repairing streets and sidewalks including abating debris, weeds, and illegal dumping.



We're Hiring Lifeguards & Pool Managers for Swim Season 2021!

The City's Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department is gearing up to open the 2021 Swim Season from May (Memorial Day Weekend) through September (Labor Day) at these five locations: Jerry Lewis Family Swim Center, Delmann Heights, Hernandez, Encanto Park, and Nunez Pools (depend on staffing availability). The available positions are:

Lifeguard \$15.13 - \$16.68/hr Senior Lifeguard \$17.19 - \$18.95/hr Pool Manager I \$19.02 - \$20.97/hr

Aquatics Training and Certification classes are offered in March, April, May, and June for Lifeguards and Pool Managers ages 15 years and up. Junior Lifeguard Training Certification classes for ages 11-15 years are offered in three 2-week sessions in June and July at a subsidized fee thanks to a grant contribution from Kaiser Permanente. Cesar Chavez Day Celebration - March 31, 2021

Cesar Chavez (1927-1993) was an American labor leader, community organizer, and Latino American civil rights activist. He was a union leader and labor organizer who dedicated his life to improving the treatment, pay and working conditions for farm workers. In 1962 he founded an organization that grew into the United Farm Workers Union, where he negotiated hundreds of contracts and spearheaded a landmark law that made California farm workers the only ones in the nation entitled to protected union activity. In his most enduring legacy, Cesar Chavez gave people a sense of their own power. (2017, Biography.com)



O'Malley's Close Call

On Wednesday, February 17th, San Bernardino City Animal Control Officer Arianna Gonzalez was called out to rescue an injured cat on the 215 Freeway onramp at Baseline Street. Animal Control Officers Melinda Driscoll and Derek Stevens responded to assist in the rescue. San Bernardino Police helped block the onramp entrance to keep cars from driving onto the freeway while Animal Control attempted to confine the cat.



As you can imagine, the cat was terrified and as soon as our officers pulled up, he jumped off the wall and quickly scurried under one of the Animal Control Trucks. The three officers worked together to coax him back out from under the truck and into one of their compartments so that they could get him back to the safety of the animal shelter.

Based on his condition, we think he may have been resting inside someone's car engine and jumped out when they were driving onto the on-ramp. He is a 2-year old male orange tabby underneath the smoke and dirt. Once he was with us for a couple of days, staff gave the cat, now named O'Malley, a bath. O'Malley was grateful to get help ridding himself of the engine dust and grease and purred the entire time. He has quickly become a staff favorite, chirping and meowing for visitors and basking in attention. He is now available for adoption, his ID # is A536849.




Water Department

Do you know your watering days?

The San Bernardino Municipal Water Department encourages efficient use of water outdoors. Water Use Efficiency Standards include a 3-day irrigation schedule with watering on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays before 8:00 AM and after 6:00 PM.

Here are some more ways to save:

- Keep irrigation cycles to 15 minutes or less per station per day
- Clean driveways and sidewalks with a broom instead of a hose
- Remember to turn off your sprinklers for a couple days after it rains
- Fix and regularly inspect for leaks in the irrigation system

Mayor's Corner

Mt. Vernon Bridge Tour

Dismantling of the Mt. Vernon Bridge is underway! Mayor John Valdivia and Council Member Theodore Sanchez toured the progress of the bridge reconstruction on February 5, 2021, along with Senator Connie Leyva, Assembly Member Eloise Gomez Reyes, and Supervisor Joe Baca Jr.



Hosted by San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA), the elected officials were invited to see the work done thus far on the \$230 million dollar project. Determined to beautify the city and ensure the safety of its residents, the city of San Bernardino joined a cooperative funding agreement with SBCTA, and BNSF to share costs not covered by federal funds.

Once complete, the structurally-sound bridge will feature widened travel lanes, sidewalks, a center median and new bike lanes. The historic bridge, connecting north and south San Bernardino to the west side of town, was closed to traffic on December 29, 2020 and is expected to remain so until 2023.

Advisory Committee Opportunities Available

The City of San Bernardino has started work on updating the General Plan and creating a Downtown Specific Plan. As part of these two large undertakings, Advisory Committees have been created as an important component of the public participation program. These committees will participate in a series of meetings and serve as the primary communication channels for making recommendations to the Planning Commission and the Mayor and City Council.


