Soccer Field Rehab at Nunez Park

Over the past couple weeks, our staff replaced existing turf, prepared the surface, furnished and installed a new turf system. This project is currently in the construction phase and 20% complete. The contractor reported base settlement issues throughout the field. There is missing stone along the edge and a gopher tunnel system (holes) on existing base.





The repair along the edge requires approximately two tons of stone and Public Works will discuss with Parks & Recreation on the gopher's tunnel matter.

Arbor/Earth Day Park Revitalization

On Saturday, April 24, 2021, the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department hosted an Arbor Day/Earth Day Park Revitalization at Perris Hill Park. The purpose of this event was to provide San Bernardino residents an opportunity to give back to their community by taking part in the park revitalization. In addition, the department collaborated with the SB Water Department, Public Works Environmental Services and Burrtec, which provided additional resources such as, water conservation information, oil recycling containers and mulch and compost. The event had over fifty volunteers register to assist with the park clean-up which entailed, trash pickup, filling in squirrel holes, leveling the mulch around the playground structure and leveling the horseshoe pits.
