Permanent Affordable Family Housing

The City is pleased to announce that Foothill Villas apartment homes, located at 2601-2675 W. 2nd Street, has received over \$70 Million in tax credit allocations and tax exempt bonds for the rehabilitation of the entire complex, consisting of 239 units. The total project cost, including acquisition and rehabilitation, is \$91 million.

The apartment homes will be affordable to families earning 50% of the area median income (\$37,650 for a family of four) and 60% of area median income (\$45,180 for a family of four).

Work on this rehabilitation is estimated to commence in February 2021 and is estimated to be complete in December 2021. This project, facilitated by the developer Standard Companies, will bring a large investment and well paid construction jobs to the City of San Bernardino.

Although the development does not currently have vacancies, Housing Staff will work with the developer to share information with San Bernardino residents about a waiting list, and the application process for a newly refurbished apartment home at Foothill Villas.

For the first time in recent memory, the San Bernardino Animal Shelter achieved a no-kill status for the month of September, meaning that one way or another 90% of dogs and cats impounded there left alive.

This achievement is a testament to the dedication and commitment of the staff who work with the animals on a daily basis. Animal Services is excited about becoming a resource to the community, supporting both citizens and their pets.

Successful Rescue Mission







On October 20, San Bernardino City Animal Services impounded 37 cats from one residence in the City. This impound brought the total number of cats at the shelter to over 100! Staff reached out to local rescues and other animal shelters for assistance in taking any of our longterm residents to free up space for the new arrivals. The PAW Mission Rescue, Cat Angel Network, Rancho Cucamonga Animal Shelter and Inland Valley Humane Society, in addition to some of our other rescue partners, responded with taking 77 cats from our shelter for adoption to the community.

Subsequent to that, the shelter impounded an additional 106 cats that were running stray or surrendered by their owners. Staff reached out to other shelters in California as well as to the ASPCA (American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals) for assistance. North Bay Animal Services in Petaluma answered our call and together with the ASPCA, we transported an additional 24 cats to Northern California. The ASPCA's transport team picked the cats up from the shelter on November 5th taking them to San Bernardino Municipal Airport where they were flown to Petaluma by Pet Rescue Flights.

We are thankful for the relationships with other shelters and rescue organizations and for the help and support they are providing to our animals.

MOUNT VERNON AVENUE BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

An iconic landmark within the City of San Bernardino, the Mount Vernon Avenue Bridge, built in 1934, is 86 years old and in need of replacement.

Taking the lead on the bridge rebuild is the San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA), in collaboration with the City of San Bernardino and the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans).

In preparation of the rebuild, demolition of the bridge is scheduled to commence and the bridge will be closed on December 18, 2020. The demolition process is expected to take four (4) months followed by the bridge replacement construction. We anticipate reopening to the public with a brand new bridge in 2024.

The project has been well planned out with the community in mind!

Understanding the iconic structure and rich history the bridge has, the new bridge has been thoroughly planned to ensure we capture the features of the bridge's rich history.

In anticipation of the closure, the San Bernardino County Fire District used a computer program that calculates response times to determine the impact of the bridge closure. Results showed response times would be minimally impacted. County Fire has automatic aid agreements with both the Colton Fire Department and Rialto Fire Department to assist, if needed. County Fire

San Bernardino City Youth Reinvestment & Development Program

The City in partnership with the Urban Conservation Corp. and Operation New Hope was awarded the Youth Reinvestment & Development Program grant last year. This program provides at risk youth with academic support, group and individual counseling, and vocational training.

Since the grant award was received last year, the program has served over 144 San Bernardino youth. Program participants are provided with job training opportunities in the Public Works Department, addressing right-of-way maintenance issues throughout the City.

In the last two months, program participants have completed 14 public work projects for a total of 224 hours. Beautification projects include weed abatement, brush, small tree trimming, illegal dumping pick-ups, public streets and empty lot clean-ups throughout the City.









Storm Water maintains 118 miles of Storm Drains and 1,535 Street Culverts

Both branches will be open Monday through Thursday from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm, for limited library services, with a maximum capacity of 10 visitors.


